

### Maybush Copse official opening - Easter Saturday



Maybush Copse, the 8 acre community woodland was officially opened to the general public on Easter Saturday.

The main entrance to the site is from Cot Lane, about 200m south of The Barleycorn, on the right hand side as you go south.

Access is limited to the foot paths at present because, at the time of writing, very little of the seed sown on the grassy areas had germinated, so the public is asked to keep off these areas.



Paths include a 140m wheelchair accessible path, and 550m of woodchip surfaced path within the site. There are also some benches with wonderful views over the

fields to the harbour. A permissive footpath gives access to the site from Nutbourne, Prinsted and Southbourne and joins up with other harbour footpaths.

Parking on Cot Lane is limited so please come to the site on foot or bicycle, if possible. Cars can be parked on the verge, but keep well off the road because Cot lane is also used by wide agricultural vehicles and lorries. Dogs are permitted on the site, but owners are asked to keep them under close control. Horses and bicycles are not permitted on the site.

Thanks for your support. Without the combined efforts of residents, the Chichester Harbour Trust and the Chichester Harbour Conservancy we wouldn't have Maybush Copse. Once the grass has grown we will have a bit of a party. Stephen Johnson - Chairman Maybush Copse Friends.






140 local artists are opening up their studios to the public during the hugely popular, annual Chichester Art Trail, which takes place on the weekends of 5th, 6th, 7th

### Letter from the Garden Workshop by Phil Rumsey

After scrimping and saving we've been on the holiday of a lifetime yet again. When you've been on safari in Africa armed with a book on the wild life and a camera, it's not surprising if one develops an ambition to go once more and then again. Our ancient tome of South African roads was probably out of date so I down loaded the relevant maps onto our satnay, Wainetta with the sexy Irish voice, to take with us in the hire car. As the regular reader of these letters will know, risking having the satnav in the same car as she, the family navigator would be foolhardy, but I felt that I had proved Wainetta's worth many times in the past and would do so again. Crossing the border twixt South Africa and Swaziland proved to be a bit of a marathon. We entered the SA custom's post just behind a coach full of Soweto church choirs leading to a long wait. Eventually, passports stamped we crossed into Swaziland to be told, when we reached the head of another long queue, that SA customs hadn't stamped Hazel's passport. With me now stuck in Swaziland she had to walk past the heavily armed border guards of both countries and queue again, only to find she'd been given my passport. So there we were both sides of the border with the wrong passports. She who was getting a bit fed up, crossed back grabbed me and raised Cain in Swaziland custom post, ran the gauntlet of the guards, raised Cain in SA marched back to past bemused guards to Swaziland, got in the car and we got arrested. The custom's man hadn't spotted all the to and fro shenanigans and thought we were trying to get in without the paperwork. Driving through beautiful Swaziland looking for our next lodge in a game reserve Wainetta made it clear we had ten miles to go when it started, the sadly predictable disagreement, both women telling me where to go, with increasing antagonism.' We've just passed a sign for the reserve!' yelled she who didn't have the benefit of GPS. I stayed calm and tried to reassure her that Wainetta was plotting the fastest route, not the shortest and she had never been wrong yet. I drove on with complete confidence. I will admit to a slight uneasiness as the miles went by and we found ourselves driving into and through an industrial estate with hundreds of people knocking off from work



and an increasingly exercised Hazel gently screaming in my ear. However Wainetta said we'd only half a mile to go. With just a hundred yards left



we cleared through the buildings and back into countryside. Confidence returned I turned right as instructed, Wainetta assuring me that we had reached our destination and found we were halted at the impressive gates of Swaziland jail. Fortunately she, who for once was proved right and had triumphed over satellites cursed machines and her husband, try as she might to make me suffer with endless told you so's, couldn't contain her sense of humour and to the consternation of the warders at the gate burst into shrieks of laughter. We had to back track ten miles according to the map, maybe I might take a little while before I risk the two women in the car again.---- Our favourite lodge of the holiday was in the Kruger Park and could only be reached by driving five miles over a very rough unmade road, all the worse for unprecedented rain fall, thirty nine inches in three days, just a couple of weeks before. But well worth it, the country was beautifully green with wild flowers everywhere. We had booked for three nights but ended up staying nine. In the South African game reserves more often than not the ranger carries a gun and we asked ours under what circumstances he would use it. We got a long and interesting talk on how to behave if we should happen upon big cats on foot. About how predators have forward facing eyes like us and providing we face them and flap our arms making as much noise as we can the animal thinks we're a predator and will back off. Though if we run away he would act like any cat and will not be able to resist chasing. From what I've seen of big cats close up I hope never to put that to the test. However he still hadn't revealed when and why he would use the gun. When pressed he said if anybody in a team he was guiding tried to run away he would shoot them in the leg to stop them. Sent a little shudder down our spines before we spotted his grin. Got a feeling it would be a close run thing though before he'd shoot an animal. Phil.

It has held up well this winter but with so little rain that is not a surprise. Please let us have your views on different surfaces or even if you are happy for it to remain as it is.

### **Bosham Old Timers**

### Hi Anne and Fiona.

Thanks for your editorials in the March issue regarding cyclists who refuse to ride on the cycle paths. Your comments echo my thoughts exactly when I am held up in the morning rush hour by a cyclist who is riding beside a completely empty path provided for their benefit and safety.

My other moan regards motorists in Bosham who park too close to junctions making it difficult and dangerous for other motorists and pedestrians The main problem area seems to be near the Co-op in Station Road/Williams Road where cars are frequently parked alongside the shop, right up to the junction, while others are parked partially on the pavement on the south side of Williams Road, and more are opposite the junction on the west side of Station Road. There is often near gridlock here with cars trying to negotiate the area. The drivers of the parked cars seem more concerned with walking as short a distance as possible to the shops than with the hazards they cause for both motorists and pedestrians.

I have looked up what the Highway code says on this and Rule 243 states "DO NOT stop or park ...... opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction". Rule 244 says that you should not park partially or wholly on a pavement because of the obstruction/inconvenience to pedestrians, wheelchair users and pushchairs.

Ideally some double yellow lines in this area would solve this problem, but in view of the fact that people seen to ignore those placed between the shops and Arnold Way I'm not sure this would work. If all motorists could be more considerate and obey the rules traffic would flow much more easily and safely, and maybe we can prevent a serious accident from taking place. ### Ed's Nature Corner



The harbour now seems eerily quiet as the bulk of the winter visitors have departed for their breeding grounds. The background cronking of Brent Geese and whistling of Wigeon, has yet to be replaced by the shrill call of Terns feeding in the harbour. Away from the water it is a different story, listen for male birds are singing to attract mates and defend territories. Yellowhammers (now sadly a much rarer sight) will be singing from hedgerows with their 'little bit of bread and no cheese' call. Foxes will have given birth to their cubs and as the cubs grow so does their appetite. Vixens will have to hunt in the day to get enough food for their families.

Water Voles become increasingly active as they start their breeding cycle. Bats are also emerging from hibernation. This week I saw my first bats of the year, two Pipistrelles zooming around at roof height in the garden. You may also have noticed a small white flower growing in dense mats at the very edge of larger roads, this is Danish Scurvy Grass. This salt loving plant has escaped its normal coastal range and is now exploiting the conditions created by gritting our road with rock salt in the winter.


### A YEAR OF PHOTOS







"Our thanks must go to Chichester Harbour Conservancy for their continued support and to Macmillan Cancer Support for once again wishing to work in partnership with the Hospice."





### Hambrook and District Residents Association

A ballot organised by Hambrook and District Residents Association (HDRA) to see if residents of Nutbourne would favour a boundary change that would take them from Southbourne into an area administered by Chidham & Hambrook (C&H) parish council has now been completed. The idea was first suggested by councillors from C&H who suggested that those in Nutbourne (Maybush Drive, Flatt Road, Cot Lane (north), Pottery Road, Broad Meadow, Langston Gardens and Main Road) were naturally drawn to Chidham. Rejected by Southbourne parish council, it was agreed that HDRA (as a neutral body) should conduct a survey. And that is what HDRA did! Early in March, a total of 210 householders (all in Nutbourne) were provided with a ballot paper to vote on whether they wished to remain in Southbourne or be brought into the civil parish of C&H. There is now a result.

In total 24 (12%) have so far been returned (this representing a possible 60 residents) – so a little disappointing. Of these however, there was an overwhelming (88%) desire to be part of Chidham. Most definite were the residents of Cot Lane and Maybush Drive with a 22% response rate and a 100% 'yes' for C&H.
